


#### **NANCY SANDERS**

In June, Phil and Evi attended the 223rd General Assembly of the PCUSA in St. Louis, Missouri. Phil is president of the National Association of Presbyterian Scouters and was an Exhibitor and a registered Observer. Evi was a registered Observer and served as a Process Observer for four committees.

Evi thought it was a wonderful experience to observe the PCUSA in action, with over 2,000 people in attendance!
